


The traffic situation in and around Milton Park is ridiculous. Until someone co-ordinates the traffic lights on the Milton interchange with the mini-junction and pedestrian crossing inside the Park the slip roads off the A34 will be constantly blocked, causing chaos on the A34 like it was yesterday and several times previously.

I have a suggestion, why don't you make a south-bound slip road off the A34 earlier, coming across the old Milton village football club field into a new mini-roundabout at that silly junction from Milton village (see map). That way it will alleviate the amount of traffic trying to mingle from the two lanes (off the A34 and Milton interchange) into one lane. It should also reduce the amount of traffic build up off the A34.

Another suggestion, why don't you make several Park & Ride hubs at Grove, Harwell campus, Milton Park and Culham. If there were regular bus services at a reasonable cost, people would use it and not a money making machine.

Just a few thoughts from a concerned local, as we fear that many businesses will either go out of business, move with loss of jobs for some, especially if staff cannot get into work on time, unhappy customers, delivery schedules not being met.
