The plan does not support sustainable public transport enough. In particular the opening of Grove station core policy 19. The plan should say that no planning permission should be granted for house building until a firm plan is drawn up to reopen the station. Also consideration should be given to re establishing Steventon railway station. If the local MP's could spend more time approaching central government for these sorts of initiatives instead of building more slip roads to generate more traffic then we would have a better environment.

In the plan there is far too much emphasis on road development, opening new slip roads, modifying junctions and safeguarding land for new highway schemes. See Fig 5a There is plenty of non-green belt land to the south of Abingdon (Fig 6.3) for most of the houses needed and this is where most of the employment will be.
