The increase in housing in the East of Harwell Campus area is likely to result in a significant increase in road traffic in the immediate area. This is due to the large size of the proposed development in conjunction with projected increased employment on the Harwell Campus itself. The A34 trunch road is also immediately next to the proposed area. This increase in traffic will result in an increase in the levels of particulate pollution in the respirable particle size (PM2.5) attributable to vehicluar traffic. Recent studies have shown that increased levels of pollution have a significant impact on public health. I do not believe that the council has taken this projected impact into consideration nor do I believe that it has consulted with Public Health England regarding the potential health impacts on the existing and projected population.
