The consultation process has been extremely poor and rushed. Meetings have been held often at some considerable distance from people's homes and at times (all at 6pm) when people may be unable to attend. The consultation process requires a high degree of mobility, and literacy. The SMHA

seriously understates the opposition to the proposals (several thousand written comments and comments voiced at public meetings). The whole process has also ignored independent expert advice.
