The Vale has published its own comments on the Green Belt Review which it commissioned from external companies, and said that it disagreed with removing the land packets 4 and 5 from the Green Belt because development here would damage Cumnor's Conservation Area and so would not be allowed. The Vale concluded that these changes would therefore serve no purpose. In my opinion the same argument applies to the other two areas (6 and 24). Although Cumnor is not identified as one of the Vale's strategic housing areas in the Local Plan, villagers also know that the protection offered by the Conservation Area has not deterred developers from approaching owners of land within these packets following publication of the Green Belt Review. We can only conclude from this that Green Belt protection is strictly necessary. In my opinion, the existing Green Belt boundaries around Cumnor have achieved exactly what was intended when they were established.

There seem to be "no exceptional circumstances" cited which would justify the Cumnor boundary changes in the context of NPPF rules. Local opinion on this matter as expressed in the consultation has been ignored by the Vale, with its final decision being made obscure even to our Parish Council.

The purpose of the Green Belt is to prevent urban sprawl. To date, the Green Belt between Oxford and Cumnor has enabled the village to retain its distinctive identity and preserve its rural character despite its proximity to the city. Removing the four areas mentioned above, together with land packet 3 beside the A420, risks turning Cumnor into an extension of the Oxford conurbation through the building development that would almost inevitably follow. The locality needs its open spaces, not merely for humans but also the for the animal and plant life which is entitled to thrive in them.
