Unsound

Abingdon is already an over congested town centre, with insufficient parking.

This plan takes no account of the increased traffic that will result, leading inevitably to increased congestion, and competition for the few parking spaces.

The end result of this is that residents will choose to go either north to Oxford, or south to Didcot, where they know they can park and not sit in traffic jams to get to the shops. Hence this plan will lead to a decrease in the viability of the town centre.
