Core Policy 4: Meeting our Housing Need? which specifies the scale and location of new housing ensuring development is built in the most appropriate locations UNSOUND the figure of 20,560 is unbelievaly accurate. How can such a figure be accurately forecast, 17 years in the future. The green

belt should not be sacrifcied on the basis of a 17 year projection, that could easily turn out to be nonsense. Due to economic changes, eg another recession or a boom, this figure could easily be half or double. The timescale for a prediction is to long. A more sensible approach would be to forecast what is needed in 5 years, plan for that, and then review in another 4 years to see how close to the projections you are.
