

Para. 2.65 Upper Thames Water Storage Reservoir Land has been reserved for possible reservoir but no mention of how this relates to proposed Abingdon Flood attenuation measures being produced by the Environment Agency on the same area of land west of the A34 which is covered by both policies. The EA are progressing the flood protection measures and these should have been explained in detail and included in an Appendix. It is 10 years since the terrible flood of 2007 that severely affected 300 homes and no significant protection measures have yet been taken to protect homes in Abingdon. Natural flood protection measures including strategic planting should be introduced in the Upper Ock Catchment, in addition to flood storage schemes, to provide for long term Slowing the Flow of the Ock and allow for increased flood events as result of climate change Para. 3.12 -3.15 Custom and Self Build. Support in principle is welcome but more specific allocation of pace for self build is important. A target of a minimum of 5% of new development areas allocated to custom and self build would be a good start otherwise this policy is unlikely to be implemented. Cherwell Council have produced a good model at Bicester to build on. The register has over 200 names on despite it being extremely difficult to find on the Vale website. If this policy was better explained and promoted, in the local press for example, there would be many more names on the reister. Some surveys show that 50% of those looking for a new home would like to self build which would be a fantastic asset to local economies and small builders and suppliers. At present 10 companies provide 50% of the new housing in the UK, a situation unique in

Europe and a reason for own continuing housing crisis.
