The local Green Belt Review (para 5.40) was a search to identify housing sites in the Vale's Green Belt. Once a site suitable for housing had been identified a justification was prepared to remove it from the Green Belt. Most of the ?justifications? were almost identical and it was clear that the sites had not been visited. One site was in the middle of the Cumnor conservation area that contains important historical remains.

The allocation of 1,510 houses on four sites in the Green Belt should be removed (N Abingdon 800, NW Abingdon 200, NW Radley 240 & S Kennington 270). These sites should be removed from the Green Belt, together with the other 11 sites identified for building on in the Green Belt. This means that the boundary around the Green Belt should be returned to the line held before this Local Plan was being produced. All references to the ?local Green Belt Review? should be deleted.

As stated in Paragraph 1.21, the Vale Council should work with the County Council and the other Oxfordshire District Councils to complete an Oxfordshire-wide Strategic Green Belt Review. No land should be removed from the Vale's portion of the Green Belt and no strategic sites should be allocated until this review has been completed.
