The evidence in this plan is not sound and is flawed stating "capacity issues on A420 are likely to occur".

Capacity issues already occur and have done for years. They exist on a daily basis at peak times in particular at the Shrivenham entrance to the A420 going west. The traffic backs up all the way (3 miles) to the next roundabout at Sainsbury on the A420. This is local knowledge from experience of residents at Shrivenham.

Putting in 8000 houses along this stretch of A420, 3 miles west to the Sainsbury roundabout, will produce substantially more traffic and demonstrates a lack of duty to co-operate between the Vale and Swindon BC.

The top findings on public comments in 2014 on the Vale Local Plan as reported by the Vale were:

Calls for the provision of infrastructure *before* development and concerns about the *lack of infrastructure* to support new development.

Traffic and congestion from the new development, and cumulative impact on the existing road network

Concerns about harm to the identity and character of existing settlements including coalescence

The Plan has not taken sufficient account of main public findings and evidence on traffic capacity issues.

The Local Plan consideration for a roundabout at Shrivenham will only make worse the daily blockage going west on the A420 and the plan should consider a dual carriageway at this point.
