The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee recently held a period of public consultation followed by a public meeting and vote .A substantial majority at that meeting voted for the 200 houses to all be placed at the West of Stanford site as proposed in the District Council Local Plan, though with a small area of green screening between the business park and the new homes. So the community of Stanford in the Vale has been shown to support the principle of having all the new homes to the west of the A417.
