- Site 4 is part of the last family-owned working farm in Cumnor. Removal of any of its land would mean the end of the farm.

  daily commuter I know about the traffic problems only too well). It takes only one rainy
  day, or an accident on any of these roads, for everything to grind to a halt for hours;
