East Hanney only just scored in the large village category with a score of 14. If it loses the mobile library as is threatened then it will fall out of the large village category by the Vales own criteria and would not be considered for development at all The village has one shop which is a community shop run by volunteers and which stocks a small amount of basic groceries and household item. It is by no means an adequate shopping facility for a large increase in population and to base the large village label on the strength of this is a misreprentation of what the village has to offer. There are no facilities for teenagers and families and there is no doctor or medical facilities in the village.

The proposed site has poor pedestrian access to the village. The bus service is reported to be under threat of reduction. There is no suitable and safe cycle way into either Grove or Wantage where the nearest services are located. It is highly unlikel that the development of 200 houses in East Hanney will reduce the need to travel by car but will increase the number of cars in the village and using the A338 which is already a very busy road.
