The National Planning Policy Framework states that the Government attaches great importance to Green Belts which it states are there to assist in safeguarding the countryside from encroachment and to assist in urban regeneration by encouraging the recycling of derelict and other urban land. I believe the Local Plan is unsound as the guidance stated in the NPPF has not been fully met by the Vale of White Horse District Council. The Green Belt on the outskirts of Abingdon will be seriously encroached by the proposed developments shown in the Local Plan. For example if the proposed Dalton Barracks, Shippon, development goes ahead to the planned extent of 1200 homes a huge chunk of Green Belt will disappear. In addition it is proposed that smaller chunks of Green Belt will also disappear on the northern fringe of Abingdon. Please see the the relevant map, Appendix L, which details the proposed alterations to the Green Belt in the Abingdon area.

I believe fewer houses should be planned on the outskirts of Abingdon so that the Green Belt remains either as it is or is only minimally encroached. This will ensure the Plan is sound with regard to the Green Belt as it will then meet the guidance given by the National Planning Policy Framework. However as a consequence of this action Oxford's housing needs must be reconsidered to ensure that the quantity of homes stated as being needed is in fact the correct number and that this is backed up with appropriate evidence available for the public to access, together with details of all derelict and urban land within the Vale of White Horse which might be recycled to meet Oxford's housing needs.


