As residents of the small village of Shippon we are extremely concerned about the following issues which have not been addressed by the planners in this Local Plan

- The Council seeks to wipe out huge areas of the existing Green Belt in order to meet the need for Oxford's inability to meet their Government housing needs. We think that this is fundamentally wrong and would question its legality.
- 2. The planned development of 1200 houses right up to the boundary of Shippon village will result in the complete loss and destruction of a village which has a history going back to 900AD. The existing sense of community cohesion and mutual support will be lost as the existing housing will be subsumed into the new housing development.
- 3. At a Local Plan meeting the planners declare that existing public transport will be sufficient to cater for the increased need for transportation, until a new infrastructure is provided, AFTER the housing construction is completed. The Abingdon access roads are already congested, especially Barrow Road in the mornings, and Shippon residents suffer from the RAT RUN through the village which exists because existing roads cannot cope with the volume of traffic. One day there will be a fatal accident as traffic speeds though Elm Tree Walk and Faringdon Road.
- 4. We were told that Whitecross plans have been altered to include a barrier space where existing residents won't have housing being built right up to the end of their gardens. Why can't this policy be applied to the houses which back onto the airfield in Shippon?
- 5. At the Local Plan meeting, a great deal of emphasis was being applied to the fact that VWHDC seemed to be let off lightly as the requirement or new houses was the smallest in Oxfordshire. There was great pressure to publish the plan before the City of Oxford.
- 6. My wife and I fully support the need for new houses in this area. All we ask is for the existing historic village of Shippon, where we have lived very happily for the past 40 years, to be better protected from the effects which will ensue from this proposed development.
