In the case of Harwell Village, the Plan has no effective mechanisms to deliver the aim stated in Section 5.57 that: "The countryside and villages will have maintained their distinctive character. The Larger Villages will have retained their separate identities.....". Nor does it have an effective mechanism to deliver point (ii) of CP 44 for Harwell Village, which sets out to 'protect from harmful development important landscape settings of settlements'.

The issue is that there is nothing <u>specific</u> anywhere in the Plan which defines <u>unambiguously</u> and <u>unsubjectively</u> what constitutes 'maintenance of distinctive character/separate identity for Harwell village', particularly on its east side with encroachment by Valley Park.

To make Section 5.57 and Core Policy 44 of the Local Plan sound, the Plan must now identify a rural gap right around Harwell Village where no development will be permitted. This particularly applies to the approach to Harwell from the east, but is not confined to this direction.

On the east side the template for Valley Park in Appendix A should include a commitment to a green corridor along the B4493 between the A34 and Zulu Farm, to preserve some vestige of a green gap between the village and Didcot.
