Further the North Abingdon Site east of the Oxford Road towards Peachcroft Farm was not included in the April Consultation and has not been subject to public consultation in the same way as other areas.

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I consider the Local Plan does not consider infrastructure in Radley thoroughly enough and with due attention on timing. Radley's roads are narrow and cannot support much more traffic at peak times. Sugworth Lane particularly is completely inadequate as, should the A34 have a Southbound exit at Lodge Hill, there will be much traffic from the intended settlement at Sandford Lane (so called South Kennington). Timing of the infrastructure is also important and should be done in advance of house building. The foul waste system in Radley is already failing and must be uprated before building houses. These aspects have not been carefully considered.

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The infrastructure plan should be reassessed to consider the existing state of facilities and services and a timeline to replace them.

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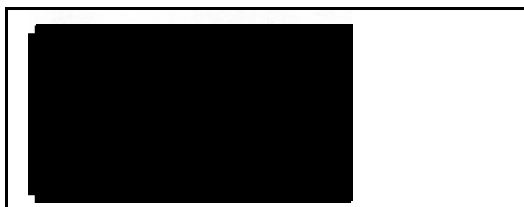


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
