The proposed Local Plan does not consider the infrastructure in Radley thoroughly enough and pay sufficient attention to the timing of the implementation of the necessary improvements in advance of work on the proposed housing developments. Radley's roads are narrow and in a poor state of repair, and cannot support much more traffic at peak times. Sugworth Lane in particular is inadequate as there will many more cars from the intended development at Sandford Lane (the so-called South Kennington site) to any new southbound exit to the A34 at Lodge Hill. The junction of Sugworth Lane also requires improvement; it is an accident blackspot with poor sight lines for those turning out onto Kennington Road. The sewerage system in Radley is already failing and must be uprated before building any more houses. These aspects have not been considered carefully enough.
