\_No development should take place within Flood Zone 3 or 2 \_ For clarity and to be in accordance with the objectives of the Strategic Flood Risk Assessment (SFRA) and Sequential and Exceptions Test evidence based documents. \_An appropriate 20 metre buffer zone, free from built development and managed for ecological benefit, to ensure no detrimental impact on the Letcombe Brook wildlife corridor and biodiversity associated with it \_ . — For clarity and to ensure development on this site allocation will not have a detrimental impact on the biodiversity associated with the Letcombe Brook.
