Comments:

• As set out in paragraph 79 of the National Planning Policy Framework:

"The Government attaches great importance to Green Belts. The fundamental aim of Green Belt policy is to prevent urban sprawl by keeping land permanently open; the essential characteristics of Green Belts are their openness and their permanence."

the proposed changes are in direct conflict with the Government policy on Green Belts

- Several of the sites within and around Cumnor are not suitable for housing, whether they were in the Green Belt or not e.g.
 - o site 3 is too close to the A420,
 - o site 2 is a recreation a ground and contains a football pitch. And must be maintained as such
 - site 5 is a green area in the centre of Cumnor that significantly contributes to the village character
 - o site 6 is high quality agricultural land and must be maintained as such
 - site 24 contains the cricket ground, another characteristic feature of an English village and must also be maintained as such, additionally, it is an area of high historical importance dating from the Elizabethan era
 - site 1 is too close to high voltage supply lines and is therefore unsuitable for housing development
 - o sites 3 must not be developed as its loss would destroy the rural views from the A420
 - o sites 4 is essential to the Cumnor Conservation Area
