Central Abingdon-on-Thames was designated as an AQMA for nitrogen dioxide in 2006 and an
action plan was approved in 2009. Abingdon's Integrated Transport Strategy (AbITS) was
subsequently put in place to alter the flow of traffic within the town centre. Pollution levels in the town
will continue to be monitored.

This is a summary of the objection by The North Abingdon Local Plan Group.

We consider that the proposed Green Belt housing developments to the North of Abingdon on Thames will make the existing air pollution problems in the town centre worse. Dunmore Road and Twelve Arce Drive will no longer be able to function as a ring road, particularly for large HGV and articulated vehicles, leading to increased traffic through the town centre. General traffic congestion will be exacerbated by the regular accidents and closures of the A34 with no alternative route. These housing developments undermine the number one measure in the Vale's "Air Quality Action Plan" to alleviate the town centre's air pollution problem. Economic development and housing needs cannot knowingly degrade public health.

The Vale's number one measure to alleviate the dangerously high air pollution in Abingdon town centre is to **encourage** traffic onto the peripheral road.

Yet building housing estates beyond the peripheral road will require the roads to be extensive remodelling to assimilate the estates within Abingdon and allow safe access to pedestrians, school children, the elderly, bus passengers, cyclists and joggers.

There is already heavy traffic along these roads which increases tremendously when the A34 is closed several times a year. The remodelling will **discourage** traffic particularly HGVs and articulated vehicles onto the peripheral road.

Building residential areas beyond the peripheral road, properly and safely assimilated within Abingdon, will increase traffic flow and air pollution in the town centre Air Quality Management Area (AQMA).
