APPENDIX B – ENGAGEMENT METHODOLOGY

The engagement methodology consisted of the following:

- an email notification to the councils' planning and corporate consultee databases, to provide a link to a video of Councillors summarising this engagement and each theme, along with a link to the survey and details of how to comment. The notification was issued through the online engagement system SmartSurvey.
- a total of 4,302 email notifications were sent out. A copy of the email notification can be found at Appendix C;
- an email notification with details as above, to the councils' community grants database. A total of 390 email notifications were sent out;
- an email notification with details as above, to all Vale of White Horse towns and parishes. A total of 68 email notifications were sent out;
- Duplication of contacts between the above databases have not been removed as they may wish to respond in their different capacities;
- a link to the survey and details of how to comment was sent to 1,012 contacts on the South and Vale Business support database and a further 50 community groups through the Community Enablement team;
- a letter to those consultees who opted in for postal correspondence. This included details of the short video of Councillors summarising this engagement and each theme, along with a link to the survey, details on how to obtain a hard copy of the survey and details of how to comment (see the email notification as an example of the text used at Appendix C). A total of 122 letters were issued;
- informing Vale of White Horse district councillors through our internal councillor e-newsletter;
- informing Vale of White Horse district council staff through our internal all staff email communications;
- a video of Councillors talking about the engagement and each of the six suggested themes proposed for the Vale of White Horse Corporate Plan 2020 – 2024;
- updating the website and publishing the video link, background information and a link to the online survey;
- a focused online survey, offering participants opportunity to indicate how important they consider each of the six themes and their corresponding illustrative projects to be and comment on each theme in a free text box. A copy of the survey can be found at Appendix D;
- an Easy Read version of the survey for online viewing or printing. A copy can be found at Appendix D;
- a press release was issued on the engagement launch date, and social media messages (Twitter and Facebook) posted during the engagement period to further publicise and encourage wide participation from the public. Facebook received 6,474 views and Twitter 1,913 views during the engagement period;
- a four-week engagement period for submitting responses between 16 July and 13 August 2020;

- the engagement was carried out in conformity with our public engagement charter¹.

Reporting methodology

- a total of 773 completed responses were received. 261 partial responses were included as at least one of the main survey questions was answered. 426 people looked at the survey but didn't answer any of the questions;
- 1 responder completed the survey and also emailed with further comments, which were added manually to the survey as a separate response.
- 6 of the 773 responses were received by email; 3 members of the public and 3 organisations/community groups. These were added manually to SmartSurvey to the relevant parts of the survey or to the 'Anything else?' section as a single response;
- 1 response to the Easy Read survey version was received by an organisation;
- Responses manually added to the 'Anything else?' section as a single response were moved to other sections of the report for analysis if they related to that section;
- a total of 2,471 comments were received. Most of the comments contained several comments or points within them and, where this is the case, each comment or point has been summarised individually for analysis purposes. Therefore, the total number of actual comments received is much higher.
- a summary of the comments is included in the main engagement report;
- any personal information supplied to us within the comments that could identify anyone has been redacted and will not be shared or published in the report. Further information on data protection is available in our general consultations [privacy statement](#) on our website;
- some spelling, grammatical and punctuation errors in the original comments raised were corrected in the main body of this report; a full list of unedited comments can be found at Appendix G.


