

Tutorial guide for four textile gift wrapping ideas



You will need: a large square piece of cloth.



Start each method with your material smoothed out with one corner pointing towards you.



This method is perfect for small boxes.
Place the box in the middle of the material as shown in the picture.



Take the corner closest to you.



Fold the corner over the top of the box.



Take the opposite corner.



Fold it over the top of the box.



Squeeze or fold in the edges of one of the remaining corners to neaten it up.



Fold this corner over the top of the box.



Neaten up the edges of the opposite corner.



Fold this corner over the box.



Tie the ends of the top two corners together in a knot (or bow if you have enough material).



Finished!



The next method is good for larger boxes. Place your box in the middle of the material as shown.



Take one corner.



Fold the corner over the box.



Take the opposite corner.



Fold over the top of the box.



Cross the corners over and tie together in a knot.



It will look like this.



Fold in and neaten up the edges of the remaining corners.



Fold one up over the box.



Repeat with the other side.



Tie together in a knot.



Finished!



The next method is good for cylinder-shaped gifts, such as bottles.



Place the gift on one of the corners.



Roll the gift up in the material from that corner to the opposite side.



You will end up with a sausage shape.



Neaten up the sides on one remaining corner by squeezing them together.



Fold the corner over the gift.



Squeeze in the edges of the opposite corner.



Fold it over the gift.



Tie the two corners together in the middle of the gift.



Finished!



This method is good for two cylinder shaped items such as bottles.

Place them in the middle of the material with space between them as shown in the picture.



Take one corner.



Fold the corner over the gifts.



Take the opposite corner.



Fold it over the gift and roll up so you are left with a sausage shape.



Carefully stand one of the gifts up.



Repeat with the other gift and hold them together.



Tie the two corners of material together in a knot.



Finished!
