Tutorial guide for wrapping paper Christmas bauble







You will need: old wrapping paper (or newspaper in this case), a compass or a mug, a pencil, a stapler and some string.



Use your compass or mug to draw a circle on the wrapping paper. Repeat this until you have several circles. You want about ten.



Carefully cut out all of the circles, they need to be the same size.




Put the circles together in a stack and fold the top one in half.




This means that you can see the middle line of all circles.



Carefully put two staples along this line to hold all the circles together.



This essentially divides the circles unto two halves that makes the nest step a lot easier.



Working on one side, separate the top two layers from the rest of the stack.



Staple these together on one side, close to the rest of the stack.



Carefully take the next layer.



Staple this to the layer above, putting the staple in the opposite side, close to the rest of the stack.



Repeat this process, alternating from one end to the other so you get a concertina pattern.



This is what it will look like at the half way point



Continue the process with all pieces until you have a sphere shape.



This is what the completed decoration will look like.



Fix your string or a ribbon to the centre fold to create a bauble, ready to be hung on the tree.
