

## Local Alcohol Profile

### 1 Alcohol-licensed premises

The dataset on which this report is based has been provided by South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils and includes pubs/bars, restaurants/cafes, sports and social clubs and off-licences.

As of November 2020, there were a total of 927 premises in South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse districts with an alcohol licence. This was equivalent to an overall rate of 3.3 per 1,000 population.

Higher rates per population were in Henley (6.7), rural South Oxfordshire (4.0) and Faringdon (3.5).
