

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

We have the initial results of the Neighbourhood Plan Scoping Survey. The Survey was completed by 52% of households. Villagers see the current strengths in the ongoing process. of the parish outweighing the weaknesses and there is an equal perception of future opportunities and threats.







Year 6 (the class at the top of the school) enjoyed a fascinating visit to the bell hanging workshop, where they learned how bells were cast and placed in bell towers. The pupils also learned about the largest bell in the world which is in the Kremlin and weighs 200 tonnes!




